## Strep B screening in your third trimester





## **Group B Strep test**

Your doctor will screen you for Group B Streptococcus, or **Group B Strep**, in your third trimester. This common type of skin bacteria:

- May be passed from moms during pregnancy
- Usually does not interfere with a normal delivery
- Is easily addressed by your doctor during delivery

## Management is simple.

If you screen positive for Group B Strep:

- You may be given an antibiotic during labor and childbirth
- After delivery, your doctor will examine your baby for signs of transmission of Group B Strep
